Clubhouse Rentals

Too many relatives and friends to host your party at home? The clubhouse is available for rentals 365 days a year, even on holidays! You can view our rental calendar at www.oakslanding.org or by calling the clubhouse at 636-225-2183.

The clubhouse only accepts checks for payment.

The clubhouse rental prices are:

Monday - Thursday	\$25 per hour
Friday - Sunday	\$35 per hour
Holidays	\$45 per hour

A deposit check of \$150 is also required per rental.

A minimum of 4 hours is required for all rentals. Set up and take down time are included in the 4 hours. If additional time is needed, appropriate rental fee applies.

For example, if you reserve from 11am – 3 pm, you may begin set up at 11am and you must be cleaned up and out by 3 pm. We need one hour for our staff to clean between rentals so please make sure you give yourself enough time. Thank you in advance for your consideration of the rental following yours.

Non Profit Organizations - require a \$25 deposit check

\$15 for 2 hours and each additional hour is \$10.

Non profits may rent the clubhouse during normal business hours Monday - Friday.

NOTE: Only members of Oaks Landing Recreational Association may rent the Clubhouse and members must be present during the entire rental time

Pool:

- * Main pool was closed due to broken glass. Pool was drained, cleaned, re-sealed and is now refilling.
- * A new, upgraded model vacuum was purchased for the pool.
- * The pool deck has a new Bluetooth speaker.
- * An umbrella on the pool deck broke. A replacement has been purchased and will ship this week.
- * The downstairs, pool access, ladies room toilet had a massive clog. Plumber told us there was an excessive amount of baby wipes flushed and that the toilet is very old and will need to be replaced soon.
- * Eighteen pool chairs to date have been replaced to a cost of \$5,400.
- * Pool loungers are scheduled to be cleaned early Sunday morning.

Meeting Minutes
June 26, 2023

The open meeting opened at six thirty with about twenty OLRA members present.

The Manager's Report was read and discussed by Connie Roberts.

The Financial Report was discussed.

The following items were then discussed:

- ♦ We still need to find a lifeguard for the month of August to open the pool during the day when school starts. It was suggested to call the YMCA to see if any of their lifeguards could help for those weeks.
- ♦ The question was asked if we needed a lifeguard at the adult pool if only adults were in the water. Our lifeguard manager, Henry, was at the meeting and he explained that if the adults were actively swimming then a lifeguard was required to be on duty. Several members thanked Henry for the good job he is doing this year.
- ♦ A member questioned the overall appearance and tidiness of the pool area. It was suggested that a checklist be written for the lifeguards to ensure they are performing the responsibilities of the position before opening and closing the pool area.
- ♦ A discussion of the incident that closed the family pool was held and several members suggested that the family holding the pool party be held responsible for the cost of the repairs due to the glass in the pool. The board will be contacting the family. Thank you to Unique for the prompt response to remedy the issue!
- ♦ The swim team was asked about the food they were selling at the swim meets and people abusing the nets on the courts during those meets. The swim team said the food was pre-packaged which St. Louis County does allow, and they will monitor the court area during the meets.
- ♦ It has been reported that adults were drinking in the family pool which is NOT allowed, and eating in the pool area which is also NOT allowed. We must remind all members that drinks are permitted on the edge of the adult pool only, and that food is NEVER allowed in either pool area!
- ♦ We are still seeking two board members from Newport Landing
The ROHA board spent some time discussing the ballot initiative they are working on to change their indentures.

The Board then adjourned.

Thank you to all who attended.

Happy Birthday AMERICA

The 4th of July is an important day for Americans. It is the day their country was born. On July 4th 1776, Congress officially adopted the Declaration of Independence and announced to the world that they were a free nation, independent from Great Britain. Although Americans have celebrated July 4th since 1777, it didn't really become a *federal* legal holiday until 1941. So, what do Americans do on this day?

July 4th celebrations often take place outdoors. People decorate their homes with streamers, fake rockets, balloons and flags. Everything is done up in red, white, and blue, the colours of the 'The Star-Spangled Banner', the name of the US national *anthem* and one of the nicknames of the American flag. The flag has 50 stars for the fifty states and 13 stripes for the first 13 colonies. In the morning, lots of people dress up and go out in the street to watch the parades. The biggest parade is in Washington D.C., the capital of the USA. Afterwards families get together by hosting or attending a picnic or barbecue. In many cities people have *block parties*. Then, they watch or play a baseball game. At night, they watch firework *displays*, usually *accompanied* by patriotic songs. Firework shows are held in many states with the Macy's Firework Spectacular in New York, typically being the most impressive. It's a fun day for everyone.

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


